



HOLY TRINITY CEMETERY

The initial findings have been very positive and we would like to take the next steps in making this a reality in the near future. THE SACRAMENTS Baptism

Expecting or new parents are asked to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible to make the arrangements and if necessary, attend the Pre-Baptismal Session. The celebration of the Sacrament is usually held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

Confirmation

The Sacrament is celebrated for 8th grade students each spring semester. This year Bishop Dougherty will be here on Wednesday, May 6, 2015. Students must be consecutively enrolled in our Parish Religious Education Program or in Catholic Schools to be eligible.

Matrimony

Couples planning to get married are asked to contact the parish office as soon as possible (no less than 6 months prior) to reserve a date and begin the necessary paper work. The dates at the Church are not guaranteed until an actual meeting with the pastor takes place.

Anointing of the Sick

To receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, please contact the parish Priest, day or night. When someone is very ill please do not wait to call the priest. It is better to have the sacrament of the sick sooner rather than at the last minute.

For ordinary sick calls (Non-Emergency):

Please notify the Parish Social Ministry Office at (570) 763-5160 if you would like a parish representative to visit a family member who is hospitalized, homebound, or in a nursing home. In compliance with HIPAA regulations (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act), health care facilities are required to protect the confidentiality and security of health data. Therefore, the only way that the parish can be informed of someone needing assistance is through notification by a family member of friend.

MEN'S CONFERENCE REPORT

On Saturday, April 25th, approximately 650 men attended the Diocese of Scranton's first annual Catholic Men's Conference. More than a dozen priests from the Diocese of Scranton and King's College, along with Bishop Joseph Bambera, also participated in the event. The four primary speakers passionately delivered presentations which challenged the attendees to live more deeply all aspects of their Catholic manhood. The men returned home "supercharged" for their faith. Bishop Bambera was visibly touched by the numbers, the enthusiasm and the unity shown by the men that were gathered at King's College in Wilkes Barre. The generosity of these men was evident as they contributed \$2,000 to a special collection which will be divided between Catholic Charities programs in the Diocese of Scranton and the Jesuit Refugee Services, which assists refugees from war and religious persecution in the Middle East. All men are encouraged to reserve April 23, 2016 on their calendars to attend the 2nd Annual Catholic Men's Conference.

50th Anniversary -Oblates of St. Joseph

The Oblates of St. Joseph Seminary, Highway 315, Laflin, will mark the 50th anniversary of the building's dedication on **Saturday**, May 30th, with a special Mass at 4:00pm celebrated by The Most Reverend Joseph C. Bambera, D.D., Bishop of Scranton. Homilist for the Mass will be Very Rev. Paul A. McDonnell, OSJ, provincial superior of the Oblates of St. Joseph USA Province. Oblate priests in the Pittston and Hazleton areas will serve as concelebrants. The Mass of Thanksgiving coincides exactly on the same day of the seminary's dedication in 1965 by the late Most Reverend Jerome D. Hannan, D.D., former Bishop of Scranton. The special day also marks the Feast of the Oblates of St. Joseph Founder, St. Joseph Marello (1844-1895). In conjunction with the Mass of Thanksgiving, there will be a Triduum preparation for the Feast of St. Joseph Marello from May 27-29 at the seminary chapel with Masses daily at 7:00, 11:00am & 7:00pm. Fr. Paul McDonnell, OSJ will serve as guest homilist at the evening Masses. Feast Day Masses on Saturday, May 30, will be at 8:00 & 11:00am with the Mass of Thanksgiving at 4:00pm.
