



16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Here's a modern paradox for you. We have technology that allows us to be constantly informed, always accessible and able to find any information we need in a few moments. We can communicate with cell phones, pagers, computers, social network sites, fax machines, landlines and even good old U.S. mail. So how is it that the more people plug in, the less informed and more isolated they become? We are less social, less communicative, more apathetic and more uninformed than ever before. Why do such powerful tools fail us?

There is no easy answer to those questions, but there is an easy way to remedy the problem. Unplug! It's time to reclaim the family dinner table, play board games, have a discussion about world events, read a newspaper together, talk to a neighbor and walk or drive somewhere without our heads buried in an iPod or text messages or BlueTooth. We need to see and hear and talk to others. We need to reconnect to people and give the batteries of life a chance to recharge and renew us. If people find religion difficult, perhaps it is because religion is a communal experience of God and we have forgotten how to be the community. Somewhere, sometime, people will research the electronic connection and discover more joy and more satisfaction in sharing a cup of coffee and a good chat. Don't wait for the details. Waiting on the Lord

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle C)

Genesis 18:1-10 Psalm 15:2-5 Colossians 1:24-28 Luke 10:38-42

God wants to dwell with each of us personally, intimately - as the mysterious guests once visited Abraham's tent, as Jesus once entered the home of Mary and Martha.

By his hospitality in this week's First Reading, Abraham shows us how we are to welcome the Lord into our lives. His self-less service of his divine guests (see Hebrews 13:1) stands in contrast to the portrait of Martha drawn in this week's Gospel.

Where Abraham is concerned only for the well-being of his guests, Martha speaks only of herself - "Do you not care that *my* sister has left *me* by *myself...*Tell her to help *me.*" Jesus' gentle rebuke reminds us that we risk missing the divine in the mundane, that we can fall into the trap of believing that God somehow needs to be served by human hands (see Acts 17:25).

Our Lord comes to us, not to be served but to serve (see <u>Matthew 20:28</u>). He gave His life that we might know the one thing we need, the "better part" which is life in the fellowship of God.

Jesus is the true Son promised today by Abraham's visitors (see Matthew 1:1). In Him, God has made an everlasting covenant for all time, made us blessed descendants of Abraham (see Genesis 17:19, 21; Romans 4:16-17, 19-21).

The Church now offers us this covenant, bringing to completion the word of God, the promise of His plan of salvation, what Paul calls "the mystery hidden for ages."

As once He came to Abraham, Mary and Martha, Christ now comes to each of us in Word and Sacrament. As we sing in this week's Psalm: He will make His dwelling with those who keep His Word and practice justice (see also John 14:23)

If we do these things we will not be anxious or disturbed, will not have our Lord taken from us. We will wait on the Lord, who told Abraham and tells each of us: "I will surely return to you."

Love and generosity start here at home. We are grateful for your faithful stewardship which sustains the life of our parish, supports our outreach and ministries, as well as maintains the level of staffing needed to put our mission into action. Thank you for your gift of treasure and commitment to do God's work here at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton.

Dear Parishioners,

Something that I placed in the bulletin a few weeks ago turned some of your heads. It was the article about the Parish Groups assisting the parish with making the end of the year payments for the Diocesan Assessments so we could stay in the black. Yes, we do struggle each month to make ends meet. We just received this fiscal year's assessment and they went up again: \$252,232.56 is what we owe between July 1, 2019 and June 30, 2020. You can do the math: That's \$21,028.55 every month before we turn on a light here at the parish.

Running the operation of these 3 buildings is quite an undertaking in itself and because we are one of the most active parishes in the diocese, we have a large staff who in Christian Justice must be paid living wages. And there are always surprise expenses that pop up as they do in your homes. You can understand how it is possible to run short each month.

Your generosity makes all these good things possible: Contributing to the running of the Diocese, Our Catholic Schools, and maintaining our parish ministries and buildings. We are here because of you and for you. While I cannot and will not ask you to increase your weekly offertory I believe it is important for you to know where all of the funds are going.

I have made one change to our Envelope Program: Replacing the Monthly Parish Groups' Funds with a Parish Assessment Envelope once a month. It's important to be reminded of our monthly duty towards the Diocese and the School. This change will take a few months to go into effect.

Along with our Fund Raising Activities, our Festival and the weekly collections we continue to go forward together as one of the most vibrant parishes around. Again, thank you for all that you do and hopefully, this helps explain our situation more clearly. If you have any other questions, I would be glad to speak with you personally.
