am going to take a novel approach this year. I'm going to let God do the heart-melting and Jesus, the changing of lives. The plain truth is that in the face of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, there are no words that can be spoken or written that compare with the miracle of God at work in and through his Son, and by extension, all of creation....that means you and me as well! When we look into the empty tomb of Easter we can see many things in the dark of that space. Among what we find is hope. Hope for this life and the next. I can't help but think when I reflect on the fact that Jesus Christ, who suffered the most brutal death ever recorded in history was not found in that grave. He was not missing, he was risen! God had taken all of the pain and hell of death and transformed it. God had turned the world on it's head because something that never, ever happened in the history of man and woman occurred. Death was defeated! The hope of Easter is two-fold. It tells us that the same God who raised Jesus from the dead will do the same for each one of us when we die. Really! Because of Easter we can hope for a life which is changed, but not ended. We can believe that our lives, (with all of the pain and suffering we experience) have meaning and that we will live forever! That's quite a big deal!


We can also draw hope from resurrection in our everyday lives as they are now from Easter. As we already said, God has turned the world upside down for His Son. Easter gives us that hope that the God of all possibilities can and will transform the world for every believer here and now. Easter tells us that the impossible is possible. 


Prayer Chain






