
The parish Social Concerns Committee will meet on Tuesday, December 11th at 7:00 pm in the Parish Hall. New Members are always welcome.


A word of thanks to all who brought canned or non-perishable goods for Thanksgiving. Everything was delivered to the Holy Family Food Pantry in Luzerne.

1st Sunday of Advent

Families make all kinds of plans. We have emergency plans, long range plans, financial plans, and plans for vacation.
