Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence.

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays* of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics over the age of 18 but not yet 59. Those bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal practices.

(Those who are ill, pregnant, on medication or special diets for health concerns, or those who work at extremely physical jobs may be exempt from these regulations)

*In the United States, the bishops have asked Catholics over the age of 14 to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent."

THE LIGHT IS ON FOR YOU

This Lent, you may go to any Catholic Parish in the Diocese of Scranton and celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation Mondays between 5:30-7:00 p.m. We would like to make this time period a special time for prayer which we all need more of in our daily lives. On the Mondays of Lent, while the doors are open and the lights are on for the Sacrament of Penance, we will also have a period of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning at 5:30 p.m. and ending with Benediction at 7:00 p.m. We need folks to sign-up to be present for about 1/2 hour of adoration so that Our Lord is not alone while He is exposed. Sign-up sheets for the 1/2 hour increments are on the tables at the entrance of the church. You will be making a commitment for the time period each Monday during Lent.

SOUP AND SCRIPTURE

During Lent we will host Soup and Scripture. Beginning at 6:00 p.m. on Thursdays, Feb 21st until March 21st, we will gather for an informal and simple meal consisting of Soup and Sandwiches that will be made by the various ministries and organizations in the parish and then listen to a feature presenter give us more "food for thought" about the upcoming Sunday's Scriptures. Everyone is welcome and we encourage families to attend. There will be something special for children as well. The first session will be held on Thursday, February 21st with our presenter, Rev. Jeffery Tudgay, associate pastor of Our Lady of the Snows/ St. Benedict's in Clarks Summit. Fr. Jeff was an organist at Holy Name/St. Mary's before entering the seminary. He was ordained this past June. We hear he is an excellent speaker and we are all looking forward to his presentation.

FRIDAYS DURING LENT

Pray the Stations of the Cross and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament (all Fridays of Lent except Good Friday) 7:00 p.m. This year we will feature a new booklet at the stations: *Praying the Stations in the Holy Cross Tradition* All are welcome and encouraged to attend this time honored devotion of Lent.

LENTEN LITURGICAL OPTIONS

The Roman Missal offers consideration for various preferences and options at masses. We will use the following options for the season of Lent this year:

Use of Penitential Rite, Form A, the *Confiteor*, *I confess to Almighty God...* followed by the sung *Kyrie* chant in Greek. (This is familiar to most of us)

We shall pray *The Apostle's Creed*, which is recommended in the missal for Lent and Easter instead of the *Neo-Constantinople Creed* which we usually say. The *Apostle's Creed* is familiar to us because it is how we begin the rosary and should be memorized by every Catholic, especially our young people. All of these prayers are printed on the cards in the pew.

Also during Lent we shall chant the *General Intercessions*. The cantor will offer the petition and we will answer with the sung response "Lord, Hear Our Prayer,"

Finally, a New Mass Setting will be employed during Lent, *The Heritage Mass*, for the Sanctus, *Memorial Acclamation* and *Amen*. *Angus Dei* will be the familiar Latin chant.

We take the options to help us slow down and focus on our prayer more attentively during this Holy Season. However, the music should remain upbeat and never drag or become burdensome. Each Sunday is still *An Easter*, and a reason to Celebrate and Rejoice. We have also dug up some "oldies but goodies" hymns that will surely bring back memories of Lent of former days to help us pray and sing the season properly.
