On Fridays during Lent join us for **Stations of the Cross**, beginning March 3rd at 7:00pm. This year we shall use a variety of different booklets to help keep the stations from becoming routine.



Monday Evenings during Lent, "The Light is On For You," in our Church. Eucharistic Adoration and Confessions beginning Monday, March 6th from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Thursday Evenings join us for something new: Interfaith Sharing and a light Lenten meal. "Faith- Fellowship- Friendship," begins Thursday March 9th at 6:00 pm with soup and sandwiches and then presentations by the Interfaith Community Leaders. Faith-Fellowship-Friendship is to promote understanding and cooperation with other religions. We hope to have presenters from Islam, Judaism, Christian and Orthodox. We have a lot to learn from one another and we may even find we have more in common than we thought (schedule of presenters to follow.) We will have a simple meal of Soup and Sandwiches and then listen to our featured presenter with time for questions at the end. We will rely on our Parish Organizations to provide the Soup and Sandwiches and Set-up and Clean-up for these Thursday sessions. The Schedule is as follows:

March 9th: Social Concerns both Soup and Set-up and Sandwiches and Clean-up.

March 16: Christian Mothers Soup and Set-up, Holy Name Sand and Clean-up.

March 23: Choir Soup and Set-up, Eucharistic Ministers, Sandwiches and Clean-up.

March 30: Knights Soup and Set-up Lectors Sandwiches and Clean-up.

April 6: **Prayer Chain** Soup and Set-up and **Parish Council** Sandwiches and Cleanup. Group leaders should coordinate the efforts of your assigned days. Thank you for your participation. Hopefully we will have lots of participation from our parish.

Lenten Regulations

- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all *Fridays of Lent
- Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics over the age of 18 but not yet 59. Those bound by this may only take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal practices.

(Those who are ill, pregnant, on medication or special diets for health concerns, or those who work at extremely physical jobs may be exempt from these regulations)

*In the United States, the bishops have asked Catholics over the age of 14 to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at (570-862-7551) or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Monsignor Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at (570-207-2269).
