Where Are YOU this Christmas?

Dear Family,

The Faith Hill holiday hit asks, "Where are you, Christmas?" The reality of these Holy Days asks us instead, "Where are YOU, this Christmas?" This is the day we celebrate, rather, we stop our lives as usual and mark time with the day that God came to find us. And so each year while we search for Christmas, Christmas is searching for us. Each year life's journey takes its toll on you and me. It seems the older we get, Christmas loses its magic, its power, and we indeed ask, "Where are You, Christmas?" The truth is that Christmas is always with us — we don't stop to realize that God is always looking for us. He looks for us in the hills and valleys of life, in our laughter and tears, in our struggles and triumphs. Christmas never ends.

We, on the other hand, get lost from time to time, and Christmas asks us all the question: "Where are You this year?", or "Where are you hiding?" Or are you so far off the track that you are lost on the journey? Be careful of how you answer that.... You may not even realize that you are hiding or lost. In fact, so many of us settle for less than God's incredible love for us that we become comfortable without Christmas, and sometimes we wish it would just pass us by. It doesn't. And it's exactly for these reasons that Jesus comes looking for us. He knows our hiding spots. He knows where we get lost or stuck in life. He comes again this year to find us, to hold us and to love us where we are and calls us to a better life.

So, where are You this Christmas? These remaining days of Advent are a good time to come out of hiding or to throw up the white flag on the path we have veered from this year. Let Jesus find you this year, wherever you are. The annual celebration of Christmas is as if God is saying to each one of us: "I don't care where you are, or where you've been. I am coming to be with you!"

The church is a safe place for you and all others to come to be found by Jesus this year and all years. As your pastor, I call each of you home to celebrate God's Incredible Gift of Love for us in Jesus. Let's invite our friends, neighbors, and family members who have been hiding or lost to come, be with us, as Jesus once again, comes looking for us. Let's answer the question, Where are YOU this Christmas? Together as a faith family and parish community. "Come, O Lord Jesus, open our graves of mourning, our caves of distraction, our tents of addiction and sin, our holes of disappointment, and find us again this year. Your people are so precious in your eyes that you will stop at nothing to find us! Come, Lord Jesus, Come!"

Bulletin Deadlines


