Dear Parishioners,

A few weeks ago Marie Gould came to a Parish Pastoral Council Meeting with a plaque that she got last Christmas. It read:

"The beauty of Christmas is not in the presents but in His Presence."

I cannot help but reflect this season on all of the ways "His Presence," has been made real in our community.

I want to acknowledge that this has been a difficult year for everyone. We experienced the loss of a church and the loss of two parishes. Indeed, together, we started from the ground floor and began to shape and form the new parish and parish church. It is never easy to start over, as so many of us are called to do at different times in our own lives. However, in the tearing down and building up His Presence has been felt.

As is so many time the case in life, grace comes to us from our trials and struggles. As one theologian put it, "there is no such thing as cheap grace." In letting go of the past and embracing an unknown and unchartered future we experience The Lord's Presence in our mourning, in our doubts, fears, frustrations and in our strong belief that despite the troubled waters we are experiencing, His hand is leading and guiding us to a safe harbor.

As a Brand New Parish Community the Presence of Jesus is undeniably with us. The successful transitions we have made over the past six months is proof of the Divine at work even in our time of searching for new life.

In a thumbnail sketch, Christ has been behind all of our successful endeavors and triumphs as evident in the very beginning of our new community when we came to together for the Inaugural Mass and Picnic our first weekend. It was amazing the number of people who were in attendance and helped out in the mass and picnic. Remember the mountain of desserts? It signified everyone's goodwill and hopes for a successful transformation.

Our Annual Summer Festival was the most successful in the history. It was truly an amazing accomplishment by all who were involved. (We can always use more folks to help us).

We held our first Vacation Bible School in the summer and our combined Religious Education Formation Program for the Children is up and running. Adult Continuing Education Programs have been started and will continue this spring.

We asked for more Extra-Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and we received the help as well as with all other ministries. Our choirs, adult, contemporary and children's are making beautiful music. The Knights of Columbus, The Confraternity of Christmas Women and Holy Name Society have all been successfully integrated into the new parish.

We have begun the Parish Pastoral Council which continues to be built-up. Social Concerns, which is an offshoot of the Pastoral Council and exacted by Bishop Bambera's Pastoral Letter is up and running quite well. We have a stable Finance Council and our offices have been successfully consolidated.

The Extra-ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion have taken on more home Communion calls to bring Jesus to the homebound and sick.

Improvements to the church property inside and out continue to be made so that everyone's worship may be enhanced.

All this is just in the past six months! We still have much work to do so hang on to your hat!

This is my vision statement for our parish. The very words of Jesus at the Last Supper must be ever in our minds and in our hearts as we move forward.
