

Lenten Regulations

- **Abstinence** from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on **Ash Wednesday**, **Good Friday**, and all ***Fridays** of Lent
- Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics over the age of 18 but not yet 59. Those bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal practices.

(Those who are ill, pregnant, on medication or special diets for health concerns, or those who work at extremely physical jobs may be exempt from these regulations)

*In the United States, the bishops have asked Catholics over the age of 14 to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Mass and Distribution of Ashes will be celebrated at 8:00 am. Additional times for Ash Distribution and Service of the Word will be at 3:45 pm, 5:30 pm, and 7:00 pm.

AWAKENING FAITH: Reconnecting with Your Catholic Faith.

This six week program will explore topics such as "Who is Jesus, Can I Accept God's Mercy, Can Mass Make My Life More Meaningful?" It is designed for both active and non-active Catholics. So come and bring someone who is not practicing the faith with no pressure placed on anyone. Just conversation and faith-sharing. There are no right or wrong dispositions or answers.

THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Expecting or new parents are asked to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible to make the arrangements and if necessary, attend the Pre-Baptismal Session. The celebration of the Sacrament is usually held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

Confirmation

The Sacrament is celebrated for 8th grade students each spring semester. This year Bishop Doughtery will be here on Wednesday, May 6, 2015. Students must be consecutively enrolled in our Parish Religious Education Program or in Catholic Schools to be eligible.

Matrimony

Couples planning to get married are asked to contact the parish office as soon as possible (no less than 6 months prior) to reserve a date and begin the necessary paper work. The dates at the Church are not guaranteed until an actual meeting with the pastor takes place.

Anointing of the Sick
To receive the Sacrament of

For ordinary sick calls (Non-Emergency):

Please notify the Parish Social Ministry Office at (570) 763-5160 if you would like a parish representative to visit a family member who is hospitalized, homebound, or in a nursing home. In compliance with HIPAA regulations (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act), health care facilities are required to protect the confidentiality and security of health data. Therefore, the only way that the parish can be informed of someone needing assistance is through notification by a family member of friend.

Church Work Progress:

This bulletin was written earlier this week, so perhaps some of the projects are completed or near completion when you read this. We are waiting for the altar floor to be stained and polished and finished this week. We will then wait for the votive candle stands that are being made for the church entrances that will be for your devotional use. We are also awaiting the company to pick-up some of the statuary and repair and clean the statues. This will be done in two stages. First, repairing St. Joseph, St. Anne, St. Jude, Our Lady of the Sacred Heart and repainting Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception. This along with the cleaning of the additional statues we hope to have accomplished by Easter. The 2nd Stage is more involved for the artists. The large crucifix will be repaired and painted and the Trinity Sculpture above the altar will be taken out and cleaned and repainted. The total cost of repairing/repainting the statues is \$6,450.00. The proceeds from this weekend and next month's Building and Maintenance envelopes will go to the candles and statues project. If you should wish to "adopt" one of the statues or candle stands, call the office for details. You may have it done in your name or in the name of a loved one. For example, the Immaculate Conception statue will cost \$1,000 to repaint and repair, St. Ann and St. Joe \$400 each, the most expensive piece is the Trinity sculpture which is estimated at \$2000.00

FOYER ENTRANCE

Above the main entrance doors there will be 3 icons placed. The Blessed Trinity, Our Lady of Czestochowa and the image of Christ's face which was a stained glass window from Holy Name Church. The three icons above the doors will be an additional memorial of the three former parishes. It will be symbolic because we all enter the church from different doors represented by the icons, but once inside we are all together as one!

SEAS ALTAR GUILD SWEET PIZZA SALE



SECURITY MEASURES

Our parish is now using the latest technology to secure the church building and the rectory. We have installed various security measures including cameras which will record all activity in the church and rectory. In the past there were a few issues with candle money missing, envelopes taken off the altar for All Souls Day, Mother's Day, Father's Day, etc., and other small amounts of money taken from the sacristy. This will record everything that goes on and will identify the person or persons responsible. While all the doors of the rectory will be secured and monitored, we ask that everyone use the side office door exclusively to gain access to the rectory, even on the weekends and after hours, as this will be the only door attended. Please note: At no time will any sums of money be kept in the rectory. Father and the parish staff will not even know how to access the collection as it will be secured immediately following each mass and deposited in the bank. These measures have been taken for everyone's security, safety and peace of mind.
