

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

Plans are being developed for the New Parish Pastoral Council. A few things to note: The PPC is not a legislative body like a Town Council. The word "council," means something very different in the church than it means in politics. We are going to develop what would be more properly understood as a Discernment Group which relies on prayer, study and the Holy Spirit for guidance. Opinions will not be solicited, votes will not be taken and members will not be elected. The purpose of the parish pastoral council, as described in canon law #536, is the "fostering" of "pastoral activity" in the parish. Because the pastor is the proper shepherd of the parish, it follows that his pastoral council possesses a consultative quality only. There is more on The Code of Canon Law on PPC's on the next page.

THE CODE OF CANON LAW ON PARISH PASTORAL COUNCILS

Canon Law makes very clear: the parish pastoral council is not a legislative body. It is not a policy-making, decree-issuing, statute-formulating council. It does not enact, decree, authorize, or regulate; nor does it prohibit, enjoin, correct, or enforce.

The new Code of Canon Law reminds us explicitly that a parish council (consilium) is "consultative only."

The parish council is not a finance council. Church law now requires that "each parish is to have a finance council which is regulated by universal law as well as by norms issued by the diocesan bishop; in this council the Christian faithful...aid the pastor in the administration of parish goods...." (Canon 537)

One whole area, therefore, of the pastor's responsibilities lies outside the scope and purview of the parish council, and is assigned instead to a distinct consultative body, the finance council.

It is clear from the new law of the Church that the scope of the parish council does not extend into the administration of the parish, but is restricted to what are called "pastoral" activities.

That is why the precise title of what we have come to know as parish council or parish advisory board is the pastoral council of a parish. The parish council, is not the grievance machinery of the parish.

The pastoral council's primary function is not to assure the faithful's right to be heard; nor is it the pastor's primary vehicle to take the pulse of the parish.

Deliberately to enhance the quality of parish life and pastoral activity is the sole purpose of creating and utilizing a pastoral council.

The purpose of the pastoral council is to counsel the pastor in the areas of pastoral activities. In a word, the role of the pastoral council is to help the pastor identify pastoral needs in the parish, help him plan pastoral programs and improve pastoral services, evaluate the effectiveness of existing programs and services with a view to their improvement or, at times, their substitution or termination.
