

UPDATE ON SHOEMAKER STREET BUILDINGS

We have contacted "King Richard's" from Alpharetta, GA, a reputable Liturgical Arts Dealer to take the items from Holy Name-St. Mary's Church Building. The altars, statues, and other sacred artifacts will be used in other Catholic Churches. King Richard's makes sure they are not put on the market or ebay to be sold to individuals or questionable parties. They only deal with Churches and many pastors have used and recommended their work from our Diocese. We are keeping the Blessed Mother Statue and the Black Madonna Window to incorporate somewhere at the Seton Campus. We are waiting for permission from the Diocese to extract and place the Madonna window in the church. The Blessed Mother Statue will be moved to either the CCD Building or Parish Hall.

The former Church, Rectory, Convent and Parish House are for sale. (They will need to be surveyed, and approved by the diocese for sale). Until then, we are responsible for the maintenance, upkeep and taxes on all of the buildings and properties.

More About the Mass

QUESTION: What does the word "consubstantial" mean and why do we say it in the Creed at Mass now?

ANSWER: Among the recent changes to the wording of the liturgy was the substitution of the phrase "consubstantial with the Father," in place of the phrase "one in being with the Father," in the Nicene Creed. Both of these are translations of the Latin phrase "consubstantialem Patri." This phrase is in a sense the heart of the Nicene Creed: it answers the question of who Christ is, a question which was the very reason calling the council that gave us this Creed. The Arian heresy had swept through the Church, sewing division and teaching that Christ did not always exist, and this council was meant to quell these disputes and give a clear answer to this heresy.

"Consubstantialem" has two roots, "con" which means "with," and "substans", which can be translated as "essence" or "being" or "substance." The term points to Christ's relation to the Father, being "one" with the Father in his very being. "Consubstantialem" is itself a translation of the Greek "homousion", which likewise means "same" (homo) "being" or "substance" (ousia). So, while the term "constubstantial" seems technical, it is pretty simple, and could still be adequately rendered "one in being [with the Father]." This translation, however, leaves out much of the deeper meanings of consubstantialem. Moreover, the presence of the word "consubstantial" itself has the ability to call to our minds this historical dispute and the importance of understanding who Jesus is.

Jesus is not merely super-human, or only human, or even only God. He is both God and man completely, a mystery utterly unique and sublime. That is what is meant by "consubstantial with the Father."

QUESTION: What does the word

"transubstantiation" mean? Why should I know it?

ANSWER:

TRANSUBSTANTIATION "The complete change of the substance of bread and wine into the substance of Christ's body and blood by a validly ordained priest during the consecration at Mass, so that only the accidents of bread and wine remain. While the faith behind the term itself was already believed in apostolic times, the term itself was a later development. With the Eastern Fathers before the sixth century, the favored expression was metaousiosis, "change of being"; the Latin tradition coined the word transubstantiatio, "change of substance," which was incorporated into the creed of the Fourth Lateran Council in 1215. The Council of Trent, in defining the "wonderful and singular conversion of the whole substance of the wine into the blood" of Christ, added "which conversion the Catholic Church calls transubstantiation" (Denzinger 1652). after transubstantiation, the accidents of bread and wine do not inhere in any subject or substance whatever. Yet they are not make-believe they are sustained in existence by divine power. (Etym. Latin trans-, so as to change + substantia, substance: transubstantio, change of substance.)" CONSUBSTANTIATION "The belief, contrary to Catholic doctrine, that in the Eucharist the body and blood of Christ coexist with the bread and wine after the Consecration of the Mass. John Wyclif (1324-84) and Martin Luther (1483-1546) professed consubstantiation because they denied transubstantiation."
