The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Confession is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in His love and mercy to offer each of us, as sinners, forgiveness for offenses committed against God. When we go to confession, we are both forgiven by God and reconciled with the Church, which was also wounded by our sins.

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we meet Christ in the person of the priest, who is ready and eager to absolve us and restore us to new life. We confess our sins to God through the priest, who absolves us in the name of Christ.

In order to receive the sacrament worthily, three things are required: contrition, confession and satisfaction.

- Contrition: In other words, we must be sorry for our sins.
- Confession: We must confess our sins by speaking about them aloud to the priest.
- Satisfaction: We must be willing to do penance and make amends for our sins. After hearing our confession, the priest assigns a penance intended to help us make amends by doing something good for ourselves and others.

Before going to confession, take some time to examine your conscience. This might be done by reviewing your life in comparison to the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, the example of Christ's life. Pray to God for forgiveness.

When you leave the confession room, take a few minutes of private prayer and thanksgiving. Plan how you will complete the assigned act of penance. Make a firm resolve to continue your conversion by a life renewed according to the Gospel and the love of God.

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all *Fridays of Lent

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics over the age of 18 to their 60th year. Those bound by this may only take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal practices.

(Those who are ill, pregnant, on medication or special diets for health concerns, or those who work at extremely physical jobs may be exempt from these regulations)
