

#### FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

You may be aware that all parishes in the Diocese of Scranton were asked to do a formal count of the people attending weekend masses this fall. For some time now, I have been watching the attendance and wondering what to do about the low numbers at some of the masses. Last spring I brought the Parish Pastoral Council in on my deliberations. A summary of the factors that went into our conversations follow:

- 1. Bishop Bambera has asked all parishes to examine the mass attendance and to reduce the number of masses which are not well attended. Presently our parish offers six weekend masses. Our church which hold upwards of 400 people, at some masses has less than 100 people attending.
- 2. Christ's presence is made manifest in four ways at the Eucharist: The Consecrated Elements of Bread and Wine, The Word of God, in the Priest and in the People gathered. Community is an important piece of the Liturgy. In an ideal world, there would only be one Eucharistic Liturgy in each parish and all would attend at the same time and place. Since this is not possible given our space and time, several masses may be offered to the community, provided a large number of the faithful are present.
- 3. Our lay ministries are stretched too far by the number of weekend masses. We often are missing EM's, Cantors, servers ,etc., because people are trying to cover too many slots on a given weekend.
- 4. As your pastor, I have the desire to be with each of you at weekend masses. At times I do not see families for months at a time depending on how the mass schedule works. The pastor should be the regular presider at all of the Weekend Liturgies.

N.B. We are eternally grateful for Fr. Urban's help over the past 5 years and he will remain an integral part of our parish filling-in when I am away and presiding at weekday liturgies from time to time.

- 5. Our mass schedule is presently too tight. There is not enough time between masses for any type of shared fellowship, and we are always rushing to get the next mass seated and ready for the next Liturgy.
- 6. We now have ample parking with the new lot and many handicap parking spaces available for each mass. This was one of the reasons we had 6 masses on the schedule, it is no longer an issue.

A New Mass Schedule will go into effect with four masses of obligation for Sunday. One mass will be offered on Saturday's Vigil and three masses will be offered on Sunday.

Effective January 6/7, 2018 our Mass Schedule will be as follows:

Saturday Vigil Mass: 4:30 pm Sunday Masses: 8:30, 11:00 am

and 5:30 pm

Monday—Friday 12:10 pm until further notice

Reconciliation Saturday from 3:45 to 4:15 pm

The 4:00 and 5:30 will be combined for the 4:30 pm Mass on Saturday. This will allow for extra time for preparation for mass after weddings and funerals.

The 8:30 am Mass will remain and the 10:00 am and 11:30 am will be combined at the 11:00 am Mass. The Sunday afternoon Liturgy at 5:30 remains.

Any changes in a parish's mass schedule is not an easy decision and it was done with great care and concern. While we are reducing the number of masses, we still have a very flexible schedule which should allow everyone to participate in the Eucharistic Life of the Parish each week. Thank you for continued presence at the Weekend Eucharist.
