## "It's Not About Me. It's About Jesus!"

Dear Parishioners,

On the weekend before Lent began, I gave a homily entitled, "It's Not About Me...It's About Jesus!" Because I believe that this is such an important statement, that I wish was my original idea, however, I cannot take credit for it since it has been a topic of spiritual writers for some time now, I want to share it with you once again.

If we could remember this simple truth, our lives would be fuller, Our families would be happier, and our parish would be more fruitful.

Contrary to what our society demands and our culture promotes, the, "What about Me? Society," that we have all grown-up with, "It's not about me," asks us to step outside of ourselves and put someone else first. That person is Jesus who is justice, peace, reconciliation, second chances, and who always points us to the Father. To be able to surrender our personal wishes, desires, wants, etc., to Jesus is not always easy. However, true love always seeks to the other ahead of self-interests. Simply put, a disciple's love for Christ must be stronger than his/her love of self.

With the approach of Holy Week, a time to reflect on the Grand Mystery or our Salvation through Jesus, I have a question to propose to you for your consideration and mediation during these Most Holy Days. "What is Jesus asking of me?" More specifically, What does Jesus want from me during this period of my life? In this time of my family's history? At this time in our parish's life? At this time of the Church's renewal?

Could it be that Jesus wants us to be more spiritual? To give up a bad habit or sinful behavior? To be more cooperative? Less critical? A more caring and loving spouse or parent or grandparent, or aunt? A more involved parishioner, giving more time to our parish? Perhaps it is to be more open to the message of Pope Francis, who is challenging us all to look at things in a new way that may be uncomfortable for some?

My prayer for each member of our parish and myself is that we will take seriously the message of "It's not about me...It's about Jesus!" We need to write this statement in our hearts, in our minds and in our souls. We need to write it across our lives, our families, our place of work, school, and across our church. And that we will be brave enough to ask the question: "What is Jesus asking of me?" during this Holy time of the year.

These two things will bear great fruit in our spiritual lives, our social lives and our lives as a parish. Take some time for a little mediation on them and may Christ's Passion Strengthen Us, Renew Us, Forgive Us, and Bring us to New Life!

For many months now, your Parish Finance Council has been charged with the duties of winding down the Parish's ownership of the former Holy Name/St. Mary's properties in and around Shoemaker Street in Swoyersville. These duties have included the demolition of the former church structure; the subdivision of the land to better reflect the usage of each property; and the appraisal of each parcel to reflect the fair market value of each.

I am writing this letter to communicate to you, the Parishioners of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, and to any other interested parties, that the Parish is seeking bids from any party with an interest in purchasing any of the parcels available for sale at the former Holy Name/St. Mary's campus. ## Lenten Regulations

- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays\* of Lent
- Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics over the age of 18 but not yet 59. Those bound by this may only take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal practices.

(Those who are ill, pregnant, on medication or special diets for health concerns, or those who work at extremely physical jobs are exempt from these regulations)

\*In the United States, the bishops have asked Catholics over the age of 14 to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.


