

### **The Second Sunday of Easter**

This Sunday has many nicknames. In the post-Conciliar calendar it is the "Second Sunday of Easter (or of Divine Mercy)". It is also called "Thomas Sunday" (because of the Gospel reading about the doubting



Apostle), and "Quasimodo Sunday" (from the first word of the Introit), and "Low Sunday". This is also the conclusion of the Octave of Easter, during which we halted our liturgical clocks and contemplated the mysteries we celebrated from different points of view. Since ancient times this Sunday has been called "Dominica in albis" or "in albis depositis", the Sunday of the "white robes having been taken off." 1 Peter 2:2-3 says: "Like (Quasimodo – from a Latin Scripture translation that pre-dated the Vulgate by St Jerome) newborn babes (infantes), long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up to salvation; for you have tasted the kindness of the Lord."



Divine Mercy Sunday, celebrated on the Octave of Easter (the Sunday after Easter Sunday, is a relatively new addition to the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar. Celebrating the Divine Mercy of Jesus Christ, as revealed by Christ Himself to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, this feast was extended to the entire Catholic Church by Pope John Paul II on April 30, 2000, the day that he canonized Saint Faustina.



# VOICES FOR VOCATIONS


