



ALL SAINTS DAY

Saturday, November 1st, is the Solemnity of All Saints. Because it falls on a Saturday this year it is not a Holy Day of Obligation,. However, we will offer two masses for the Solemnity: Friday, October 31st at 4:00 p.m. (with special emphasis on the Children) and Saturday, November 1st at 8:00 a.m. Regularly scheduled Vigil Masses on Saturday evening will be the vigil mass of All Souls' Day, which falls on Sunday this year.



ALL SAINTS VIGIL LITURGY

On Friday, October 31st, we will have the All Saints Vigil Liturgy at 4:00 p.m. Students come dressed to Mass in appropriate costumes, followed by a Halloween Party in the church hall. A light meal will be served after mass so parents won't need to cook that night. Sign-up

sheets for the party are on the tables at the church entrance.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING

The next PPC meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 4th at 6:30 in the rectory. All members are asked to be in attendance.

CHURCH WORK

In the next several weeks we will begin to do work on the inside of the church building as was previously mentioned in the *Sentinel*. New lighting will be installed which will, among other things, light up the Stations of the Cross and the crucifix and provide adequate lighting in the choir loft. The present lighting fixtures are not friendly to the new light bulbs that have replaced the traditional bulbs and just to replace the light bulbs to LED would cost about \$14,000.00. We tried doing one fixture with the LED bulbs, and it did not make a difference. Ours is one of the most spectacular church interiors in the area. The addition of state-of-the art lighting will accent its beauty.

The carpeting has not been replaced since the mid 1990's. It is now 20 years old and showing its wear. The floor in the sanctuary is also uneven in spots. We are going to correct this by placing a hardwood and marble floor in the sanctuary with new carpeting throughout the church and tile in the votive candle areas where we seem to have some burn marks in the carpeting. We are expecting this all to take place in sections of the church at a time, so there is no need to move services during the weekday as far as we anticipate.

MEMORIAL BRICKS /OUTSIDE PROJECT

We hope to have the project with the corner stones, bell, and statute of Mother Seton completed very soon. The memorial/honorarium bricks are still available for purchase. One brick is \$125.00 or you can get 2 bricks for \$200.00, a \$50.00 savings. Bricks will be available until all are dedicated, so even if you don't get one right away, there should be some availability for the future.

The forms for the bricks are located on the tables at the entrance of the church. Return your completed form with payment to the rectory. There is also an opportunity to dedicate the Statue of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, (perhaps we could have several families come together to dedicate the statue). Contact Monica at the office for cost estimates. We will also have an opportunity for everyone to purchase a small replica of the statue for display in your home. More details to follow.

PROPERTIES UP FOR BID

The Finance Council of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish is offering once again, the two remaining properties from Holy Name—St. Mary's. The former convent at 14 Barber Street and the former rectory at 283 Shoemaker Street. The Finance Council will take the highest bid over \$35,000 for the Barber Street property, and the highest bid over \$200.000 for the Shoemaker Street address. **Subject to parish and diocesan approval.** The successful bidder will need to seal the bid and have it turned into the Seton Parish Rectory at 116 Hughes Street by October 31st at noon. No deposit is required but it would be expected that the highest bidder can come up with the funds in a timely fashion as agreed upon with the council. THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Expecting or new parents are asked to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible to make the arrangements and if necessary, attend the Pre-Baptismal Session. The celebration of the Sacrament is held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

Confirmation

The Sacrament is celebrated for 8th grade students each spring semester. Students must be consecutively enrolled in our Parish Religious Education Program or in Catholic Schools to be eligible. Students must meet all requirements set by the Diocese of Scranton and the Parish.

Matrimony

Couples planning to get married are asked to contact the parish office as soon as possible (no less than 6 months prior) to reserve a date and begin the necessary paper work. The dates at the Church are not guaranteed until an actual meeting with the pastor takes place.
