

SOCIAL CONCERNS

The Social Concerns Committee is a program that is promoted by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Diocese of Scranton. There are 4 components of parish social concerns ministry, namely, prayer, education, pastoral outreach and advocacy for change.

Our parish committee is currently focusing on pastoral outreach as its initial priority, since there are many needs within our parish and local community. Some services that we are attempting to provide include: supporting the Holy Family Food Pantry, providing holiday food baskets to our needy parishioners and assisting with the Christmas Giving Tree Project. Since these activities and others being considered involve expenses, periodic fundraising activities will be necessary. Our next fundraiser is the Ziti and Meatball Dinner being held on November 9th. Baptism
