CHURCH RENOVATION UPDATE

This bulletin was composed far in advance of your reading it. While we are writing this, there is hope to have the church completed for The Great Triduum and Easter Sunday. We expect the statuary to be returned sometime this week and the touch-up work to the paint completed as well. If you have not looked up as you entered the church recently, please do so and see the three icons above the entrance doors: The Face of Christ (replicated from the stained glass window in Holy Name of Jesus Church), The Holy Trinity (A modern depiction of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost) and Our Lady of Czestochowa. These three images above the doors are a tribute to the three churches which comprise St Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish. No matter what door we enter through, we are all one when we come to the Lord's table.

CHURCH EASTER PREPARATION:

On Saturday, April 4th, lots of help will be needed to get the church ready for The Easter Vigil and Easter Masses. We especially need men who can climb ladders and lots of help carrying props and flowers in the church. Please come and help at 10:30 a.m. this Saturday. Also, this is a good opportunity for Confirmation students who are still in need of Confirmation Service Hours for the Church this year.

MARCH 31 CHRISM MASS

The Chrism Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday, March 31st at St. Peter's Cathedral, Scranton, at 4:00pm. All of the faithful are welcome to attend. Baptism Expecting or new parents are asked to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible to make the arrangements and if necessary, attend the Pre-Baptismal Session. The celebration of the Sacrament is usually held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

Confirmation

The Sacrament is celebrated for 8th grade students each spring semester. This year Bishop Doughtery will be here on Wednesday, May 6, 2015. Students must be consecutively enrolled in our Parish Religious Education Program or in Catholic Schools to be eligible.

Matrimony

Couples planning to get married are asked to contact the parish office as soon as possible (no less than 6 months prior) to reserve a date and begin the necessary paper work. The dates at the Church are not guaranteed until an actual meeting with the pastor takes place.

Anointing of the Sick

To receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, please contact the parish Priest, day or night. When someone is very ill please do not wait to call the priest. It is better to have the sacrament of the sick sooner rather than at the last minute.

For ordinary sick calls (Non-Emergency):

Please notify the Parish Social Ministry Office at (570) 763-5160 if you would like a parish representative to visit a family member who is hospitalized, homebound, or in a nursing home. In compliance with HIPAA regulations (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act), health care facilities are required to protect the confidentiality and security of health data. Therefore, the only way that the parish can be informed of someone needing assistance is through notification by a family member of friend.

Lenten Regulations

- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all *Fridays of Lent
- **Fasting** is to be observed on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** by all Catholics over the age of 18 but not yet 59. Those bound by this may only take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal practices.

(Those who are ill, pregnant, on medication or special diets for health concerns, or those who work at extremely physical jobs may be exempt from these regulations)

*In the United States, the bishops have asked Catholics over the age of 14 to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.
