

# **Burying the Alleluia**

 Today is the last Sunday the Alleluia is permitted in our Liturgy until The Easter Vigil, this year, Saturday, April 20th. Lent begins this Wednesday.

Lent is a penitential season, a time of repentance, self-examination, confession and study. For many, it is a time to prepare for Holy Baptism at Easter. The Church has traditionally marked Lent by various practices of self-denial, such as dressing the altar in somber colors, not placing flowers on the altar, refrain from using the organ's exuberant tone, and ceasing the use of "Alleluia!" in the liturgy. Not only do such practices remind us of our own need for self-denial, but when we burst forth brilliant flowers, exuberant music and shouts of "Alleluia! Christ is Risen!" on Easter Day, we celebrate the joy of Christian hope.
