

# **BUILDING ISSUES:**

The boiler in the Holy Trinity School Building has quit. We are told it is from the 1960's and is too expensive to be repaired. It needs to be replaces as soon as possible before the freeze sets in.

There is also a problem with water getting into the building from the bricks and windows on the rectory side of the school which must be attended to before the very cold weather arrives.

We will be working with the Finance Council and the Diocese this week to make the necessary arrangements. Our buildings are old and are need of constant care, upkeep and repair. ## NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegations of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
