

THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Expecting or new parents are asked to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible to make the arrangements and if necessary, attend the Pre-Baptismal Session. The celebration of the Sacrament is usually held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

Confirmation

The Sacrament is celebrated for 8th grade students each spring semester. This year Bishop Doughtery will be here on Wednesday, May 6, 2015. Students must be consecutively enrolled in our Parish Religious Education Program or in Catholic Schools to be eligible.

Matrimony

Couples planning to get married are asked to contact the parish office as soon as possible (no less than 6 months prior) to reserve a date and begin the necessary paper work. The dates at the Church are not guaranteed until an actual meeting with the pastor takes place.

Lenten Regulations

- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all *Fridays of Lent
- Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics over the age of 18 but not yet 59. Those bound by this may only take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal practices.

(Those who are ill, pregnant, on medication or special diets for health concerns, or those who work at extremely physical jobs may be exempt from these regulations)

*In the United States, the bishops have asked Catholics over the age of 14 to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent.

Church Work Progress:

The Sanctuary Floor is 90% complete. We are just waiting for the steps behind the main altar to be done and a few odds and ends. The microphones that were damaged during the floor work are on order as well as new mics for the choir which were not replaced when we did the sound system a few years ago.

The votive candle stands will be (are) back at the entrances of the church for your devotional use. Additional stands will be located at the 2 Marian Shrines near the confessional and elevator. Those statues along with St. Joseph, St. Anne, St. Jude, will be cleaned, repaired, touched-up and repainted where needed. Hopefully this will be done before Easter. The 2nd Stage is more involved for the artists. The large crucifix will be repaired and painted and the Trinity Sculpture above the altar will be taken out and cleaned and repainted. The total cost of repairing/repainting the statues is \$6,450.00. The proceeds from last weekend's and next month's Building and Maintenance envelopes will go to the candles and statues project. If you should wish to "adopt" one of the statues or candles stands, call the office for details. You may have it done in your name or in the name of a loved one. For example, the Immaculate Conception statue will cost \$1,000 to repaint and repair, St. Ann and St. Joe \$400 each. The office has a full list of items that are available.

FOYER ENTRACE:

Above the main entrance doors there will be 3 icons placed. The Blessed Trinity, Our Lady of Czestochowa and the image of Christ's face which was a stained glass window from Holy Name Church. The three icons above the doors will be an additional memorial of the three former parishes. It will be symbolic because we all enter the church from different doors represented by the icons, but once inside we are all together as one!
