

FROM THE PASTOR:

Greetings and happy fall! Now that the children are back in class and things have returned to "normal' for most folks, it is time to think about the various committees in our Parish. We would like to have everyone get involved and there are plenty of opportunities. I invite you to still consider being part of the Parish Pastoral Council. As I mentioned in previous articles, the PPC, is a consultative body of the pastor that assists with pastoral needs of the Parish. It is nothing like a Town Council. The PPC does not legislate, make rulings, vote (in the political senses of the word), etc. As an advisory committee, we let the Holy Spirit draw the best ideas from the group. This is done by a good deal of prayer. The Council has three main roles: To investigate, or look for options (solutions), research the various answers to the questions, and submit recommendations to the Pastor. There are term limits, so understand that you are not making a forever commitment when you are on the PPC. 1 year, 2 year and 3 year terms are available. Our next scheduled meeting will be on Tuesday, October 9th at 6:30 in the Rectory (please note the change of location due to the Rummage Sale.) Last meeting we had 4 people present. Please consider joining us. We need more members. Again, this is not a position of power, it is a position of service to the parish. As Bishop Bambera points out in his Pastoral Letter, "Wounded and Loved, Regathering the Scattered," all leadership in the church is exercised from a position of service, not power. So I will leave you with the guestion: Are you called to serve on the Parish Pastoral Council?
