

HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY



Today, we pause to meditate on the greatest mystery of our Faith; the Holy Trinity. There have been many controversies over the ages about our core belief that our God is one, yet three at the same time. We will never completely wrap our minds around this mystery. Perhaps the best way to express the Holy Trinity is what we learned in grade school: God is three divine persons, yet one essence. One God, three divine persons who have always been, are now and will ever be. Today's liturgy does not

attempt to explain the mystery, but rather, through the readings and prayers invite us into the mystery. Liturgy, by its very nature is not an apologetics course, but an invitation share in the life of the Trinity. Without explaining it, we do it: We worship God the Father, through God the Son, in union (or we can even say "in the power of") the Holy Spirit. Very often priests are asked, "what does this or that mean at the mass?" They can offer the textbook answer but the correct answer is that we do not know! Everything we do at liturgy is multivalent, or has many meanings. As soon as you explain something, it changes and becomes something else. Best advice, just take it all in and experience it by participating in the mystery. Don't get stuck trying to figure it all out. Some mysteries are not meant to be solved.

THE SACRAMENTS Baptism

Expecting or new parents are asked to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible to make the arrangements and if necessary, attend the Pre-Baptismal Session. The celebration of the Sacrament is usually held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

Confirmation

The Sacrament is celebrated for 8th grade students each spring semester. This year Bishop Dougherty will be here on Wednesday, May 6, 2015. Students must be consecutively enrolled in our Parish Religious Education Program or in Catholic Schools to be eligible.

Matrimony

Couples planning to get married are asked to contact the parish office as soon as possible (no less than 6 months prior) to reserve a date and begin the necessary paper work. The dates at the Church are not guaranteed until an actual meeting with the pastor takes place.

Anointing of the Sick

To receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, please contact the parish Priest, day or night. When someone is very ill please do not wait to call the priest. It is better to have the sacrament of the sick sooner rather than at the last minute.

For ordinary sick calls (Non-Emergency):

Please notify the Parish Social Ministry Office at (570) 763-5160 if you would like a parish representative to visit a family member who is hospitalized, homebound, or in a nursing home. In compliance with HIPAA regulations (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act), health care facilities required are to protect the confidentiality and security of health data. Therefore, the only way that the parish can be informed of someone needing assistance is through notification by a family member of friend.
