CHURCH PROJECTS

As you all know, when the air conditioner is used it remains extremely warm in the sanctuary while the body of the church can be very cold. There are no vents for the air to reach the altar. We are going to install two units for the sanctuary area independent of the rest of the system. This will provide air as cool as needed on the altar while the church can be warmer and more comfortable for the assembly. We are also aware the kneelers in the pew are in

rough shape. They will be replaced with all new parts as soon as possible. Adjustments are planned for easier accessibility to kneel straight up in the pews. This is not an option right now in some of the pews.

PASTORAL COUNCIL

At the November 4th Pastoral Council meeting, we established that the council will: 1.) Take a careful look at our present situation of parish & community life 2.) Assess the implications of present realities and trends for the future. 3.) Develop a vision and pastoral plan that will enable us to be the Church which God calls us to be and wisely use the gifts & resources we have been given. In the coming months, all parishioners will be asked to respond to this question: "Looking to the coming years, if you could imagine or transform our parish in any way you wished, what 3 things would you do to enhance its life and vitality?"
