St. Teresa of Avila, Feast Day, October 15. Born in Spain in 1515 to a wealthy merchant class family, following the death of her mother at the age of fourteen, she was sent by her father to be schooled by local Augustine nuns. There, she became seriously ill and while recovering, decided to become a nun. Initially prevented by her father, she finally entered the Carmelite convent at age twenty. She again suffered serious illness and began to meditate in mental prayer. Following more than 25 years in the unreformed Carmelite life, she desired to establish a house that would strictly adhere to the primitive Carmelite Rule. In 1562, with thirteen nuns, Teresa established the convent of the Discalced Carmelite Nuns of the Primitive Rule of St. Joseph at Avila. Teresa would show herself to be an intelligent, gifted organizer and administrator of her house. She died in 1582, was canonized in 1622 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1970—the first female saint to be so named.

#### PARISH FINANCES

At a recent parish meeting, it came to the pastor's attention that some important information about parish funds was not shared with all of the parishioners. As a condition of the Diocese of Scranton's *Called to Holiness and Mission* as instituted by Bishop Martino, national, or ethnic parishes, when they close, as Holy Trinity closed on June 3, 2012, must surrender 42% of their monies to the Diocese of Scranton for support of the debt of other national parishes of the same nationality. In other words, .42 cents of every dollar that Holy Trinity Parish had has been given to other closed Slovak parishes that were in debt to the Diocese. We apologize for not making this known to you before now. It was assumed that the information was communicated to you sometime prior to the consolidation of the parishes.

Because Holy Name-St. Mary's was considered a territorial parish, as the two parishes consolidated in the 1990's, all of the parish accounts were brought to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Again, as outlined in *Called to Holiness and Mission*, territorial parishes are allowed to maintain the accounts to follow the people to the new parish.

#### WORK IN PROGRESS

The current projects that are being done at the parish were scheduled to be completed before the consolidation. The plans have been in the works for sometime now. Some of the projects were proposed by the Finance Council while Fr Cirba was still pastor. They were presented to the Diocese for approval by Fr. Pisaneschi upon his arrival and were only recently approved by the Diocese after the consolidation. The work includes: Repointing the bricks of the school building, the new driveway and parking spaces for the handicapped, grand piano, new sound system, installation of the Black Madonna window from St. Mary's Church, restoration of the high altar and altar of repose, placement of the Holy Name tabrenacle in the church, construction of a reconciliation room, renovations to the rectory quest rooms, new computers and networked offices.

#### **ASSESSMENTS**

Our Parish is responsible for monthly assessments payable to the Catholic School System: \$8,045.58, and The Diocese of Scranton: \$9,612.91. The total amount of assessments paid out are greater than 2 weeks of collections each month.
