

My Dear Friends,

For quite some time now, those of us in church leadership have been talking about the need for plan to revitalize and re-energize our parishes. Conferences, workshops, convocations over the past several years have all focused our attention on the urgent need to accomplish two goals: Reach out to those who are not actively engaged with our parish and help our current parishioners find, accept and use their gifts in growing the Kingdom of God.



Let's begin today! As St. Pope John XXIII called for an opening of the windows of the church to let fresh air in just before calling the Second Vatican Council, let us open our windows and doors to this much needed movement of Evangelization. Over the next weeks, months and years we will unpack more fully what Forward in Faith entails. This thumbnail sketch is meant to convey the general principles. We need to get back to basics if we are going to meet any success in this undertaking. Since our focus is Jesus Christ, let's begin with Him.

Jesus established the church for one crystal clear reason: To "GO AND MAKE DISCIPLES." That's it...Those were his parting words to his disciples, the new church he founded. Anything that we do in the name of Jesus that does not end in that purpose is a complete waste of time. In other words, Evangelization is the only reason you and I are here. As the author Tom Corcoran recently wrote in an article, "Jesus established the church to be a *movement* of growing disciples....that turned the world upside down." (emphasis mine). The key word is **movement**. As believers we must be constantly moving...moving in the direction of Jesus himself.

Movement is not just constant motion or commotion. It is aimed at the direction of growing in our discipleship, or getting closer to the ideal that Jesus proclaimed, the Kingdom. For Jesus, God's Kingdom was a reality, not just an idea. A Kingdom built on forgiveness, compassion, service, justice, peace and above all God's unconditional and unfailing love for each one of us. As we move Forward in Faith, the question that takes center stage for us as individuals and as church is how can we make that kingdom a reality in our world?

It's not that difficult to achieve. If we put into motion and action forgiveness, compassion, service, justice, peace and love, we are helping to bring God's Kingdom to fulfillment. It takes courage, it takes conviction, and it takes change on our part. Are we willing to forgive? Are we willing to serve? To be the peacemaker? To be the servants that Christ has called us to be? Let's be clear, we can do none of this on our own. God takes the initiative every time He asks us to move. We cannot do it alone.

Today, let's recommit ourselves to the two-fold purpose of discipleship: growing (or moving) closer to Jesus and drawing others to His love. In other words, we are about the business of knowing more intimately Jesus, our Lord, and making Him more intimately known to others.

THE SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Expecting or new parents are asked to contact the Parish Office as soon as possible to make the arrangements and if necessary, attend the Pre-Baptismal Session. The celebration of the Sacrament is held after the 11:30 a.m. Mass on Sundays.

Confirmation

The Sacrament is celebrated for 8th grade students each spring semester. Students must be consecutively enrolled in our Parish Religious Education Program or in Catholic Schools to be eligible. Students must meet all requirements set by the Diocese of Scranton and the Parish.

Matrimony

Couples planning to get married are asked to contact the parish office as soon as possible (no less than 6 months prior) to reserve a date and begin the necessary paper work. The dates at the Church are not guaranteed until an actual meeting with the pastor takes place.

Anointing of the Sick

To receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, please contact the parish Priest, day or night. When someone is very ill please do not wait to call the priest. It is better to have the sacrament of the sick sooner rather than at the last minute.

For ordinary sick calls (Non-Emergency):

Please notify the Parish Social Ministry Office at (570) 763-5160 if you would like a parish representative to visit a family member who is hospitalized, homebound, or in a nursing home. In compliance with HIPAA regulations (Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act), health care facilities are required to protect the confidentiality and security of health data. Therefore, the only way that the parish can be informed of someone needing assistance is through notification by a family member of friend.
