Confessions during the Pandemic

It is not safe to return to confession at this time although Father is available before the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday in the sacristy or by appointment for the <u>most serious of circumstances</u>. The Church wishes you to use the provision of Perfect Contrition. This is going to be very important as we approach the Christmas Holidays and folks want to confess. It is recommended that you use the following instead of sacramental confession with a priest:

Perfect contrition requires the following three things: - A love of God above all else . A sincere desire for the forgiveness from sin. The resolution to go to confession as soon as possible when this health crisis subsides

MASKS ON ALL THE TIME

As the number of cases of the virus increases it is a good time to remember that you must cover your mouth and nose with a mask the entire time you are in the church building. The exception is to slide it down to insert the Eucharistic Host into your mouth. One of the most dangerous times to have your mouth uncovered is in the procession to communion and while taking the host from the priest. Please don't expose others and the priest — cover up the entire time. There are to be no exceptions to this CDC regulation.

NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegations of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.




