NOTE ABOUT THE 4:00 PM CHRISMAS EVE MASS

Many, many people want to attend the 4:00 p.m. Mass on December 24th. Our church holds a maximum of 425 people and we regularly surpass that on any given regular Saturday. While this is the ideal time for so many folks to attend Christmas Mass, it can be very problematic from a safety standpoint. Blocking entrances, doorways, stairs, etc., is against the fire code and will make it impossible for the Eucharistic Ministers to get to their places. So please do not do block the aisles, doors and stairways. The 4:00 p.m. mass is "the children's Mass," meaning there will be many children and their parents attending. Some are regulars, and some we unfortunately only see at Christmas and perhaps Easter. Regardless, we treat everyone with the same respect we would extend to Jesus himself if He were sitting in the pew. There cannot be any "saved seats," it's first come, first seated.

Considering all of the factors involved, I am appealing to you to look at all of the masses we are having this year and pick a mass other than the 4:00 p.m. We will watch the attendance at each mass this year and make alterations necessary to the schedule for next year. One possibility is that if the 4:00 p.m. mass is too chaotic and unmanageable for the church we may move it to they gym next year to accommodate everyone who wishes to attend.
